The Year in Review

In 2016, Cancer Services of New Mexico (CSNM) served over 1,400 New Mexicans coping with cancer. It is tremendously rewarding to make a difference in the lives of so many of New Mexico's cancer patients/survivors and their loved ones. Throughout the year we continued to make substantial progress in many other important areas, including volunteer recruitment/board development; relationships with New Mexico's oncology community; fundraising; and development of our operational capability. The following are some highlights:

Program Offerings

Our Legal, Insurance, and Paperwork Assistance (LIPA) Program has continued to have tremendous

impact. In 2016 it continued to be our largest program, serving 547 New Mexicans coping with cancer. To date, this program has helped clients access over \$8.4 million in medical, legal, and financial benefits.

Through LIPA, we offer free consultations and individualized clinics that help New Mexico's cancer patients/survivors and their loved ones manage the many complex legal, insurance, and financial issues associated with a cancer diagnosis. We have assembled an impressive group of volunteer attorneys, financial/insurance experts, and health care professionals to lead this program.

We also distributed over 300 copies of our **Cancer Treatment Organizer** statewide. This free recordkeeping tool designed by a New Mexican cancer survivor offers a simple system for keeping cancer-related records organized and easily accessible. In addition, our dedicated LIPA website – www.NMCancerHelp.org – includes links to close to 100 resources to assist those coping with cancer-related legal, insurance, or financial issues.



Cancer Services of New Mexico's Spring 2016 Family Cancer Retreat

April 22-24, 2016 - Albuquerque, NM

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We continued to offer our **Family Cancer Retreat** twice a year in 2016, with over 540 people from more than 220 New Mexican families attending these free programs in April and September. This is the largest general cancer education program in New Mexico, and the largest program of its type in the U.S. Each three-day retreat focuses on educating New Mexico's adult cancer patients/survivors and their loved ones on the process of surviving, from the difficulties of handling the initial diagnosis, through coping with therapy, through a variety of medical and social challenges relating to at-home care and the emotional issues associated with surviving.

In addition to providing a temporary escape from the day-to-day challenges of living with cancer, the retreats foster development of supportive relationships between participants that can continue in the months and years ahead. The entire program, including food, lodging, and all educational activities, is provided at no charge to participants. There is no other program like this in New Mexico. We continue to receive tremendous support for the Family Cancer Retreats from New

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Mexico's oncology community. Each of our program agendas in 2016 included 35-40 speakers and presenters, including 15+ of New Mexico's leading physicians. Over 40 oncology groups, cancer services agencies, and other organizations/individuals referred people to the program last year.

Our promotional materials were displayed in virtually every oncology clinic in the state and in many cases physicians, nurses, social, workers, and other professionals personally encouraged specific families they felt would benefit to attend.



In 2016 we continued distributing **Family Cancer Resource Bags** statewide. Through this program, we offer free information kits that help newly diagnosed parents and their children aged 3-18 cope with the impacts of cancer on their family. This is the only program in NM which specifically focuses on educating parents with cancer on how to communicate with their children. During the course of the year we distributed over 130 bags to families throughout New Mexico.

We continued our **Community Outreach** activities in 2016, speaking with the public about New Mexico's cancer-related services and distributing educational materials at a wide range of health fairs and community-sponsored talks throughout the year as well

as publicizing our programs and services in a variety of ways.

Our newest program, the **Caregiver Support Program**, continued to grow in 2016. The program provides personalized support to New Mexicans caring for a friend or loved one with cancer. Each cancer caregiver who enrolls in the program is matched with an experienced volunteer and the two decide the best way to communicate – in person, by phone, or electronically. They also decide how frequently to interact and what topics to cover. In this way, the program is customized to address the issues of greatest concern to each client, in a format and timeframe that best meets their needs.

Volunteer Recruitment & Board Development

As a volunteer-driven organization, all of our programs depend on the generosity of our volunteers. In 2016, hundreds of people volunteered to support our efforts (up from a total of five volunteers when we launched CSNM in 2001).

In 2016, we once again had the wonderful problem of having so many people interested in helping out with our programs that we had a waiting list of prospective volunteers. The majority of our volunteers are former clients. In addition, insurance experts along with many attorneys and financial experts volunteered to help us deliver our LIPA program.

Our Board of Directors makes invaluable contributions to CSNM's activities, providing everything from organizational oversight to technical expertise to day-to-day support for program development and implementation activities. At year-end, our Board Members included:

We also continue to work closely with other cancer services organizations around the state to coordinate programs and avoid duplication of effort. We are active members of the New Mexico Cancer Council, the statewide coalition of public and private partners that coordinates development, implementation, and evaluation of the NM Cancer Plan. This involvement ensures that our programs continue to support the NM Cancer Plan and supplement or complement other organization's efforts.

Fundraising

Our work would not be possible without the generous support we receive from our many dedicated supporters. In 2016 we received important **general program support and/or support across more than one program** funding from Ethicon Endo-Surgery, Carl C. Anderson, Sr. and Marie Jo Anderson Charitable Foundation, Lineberry Foundation, Rotary Del Norte Foundation, and New Mexico Children's Foundation. In addition, we received many grants and contributions targeted at specific programs.

In 2016 we were deeply saddened that People Living Through Cancer (PLTC), one of the first cancer support organizations in the country, ceased operations. Endowment funds are established with the purpose of supporting an organization's mission and purpose in perpetuity, so when a non-profit shuts down its endowment funds are transferred to an organization whose work aligns with the retired organization. We are honored that the Albuquerque Community Foundation, which served as a steward of PLTC's endowment, chose Cancer Services of New Mexico as the beneficiary of these funds. Income from this endowment will help support our work in perpetuity

In addition to submitting charitable donation, grants or sponsorship requests CSNM launched the "Sponsor a Family" initiative in 2016. This program allows individuals or groups the opportunity to sponsor a family to attend one or both of the retreats in the year. Over \$8,500 was donated to CSNM and the CSNM Foundation to support our Sponsor a Family during 2016. In addition, John and Georgia Gronager designated a portion of the proceeds from their phenomenal holiday light show to sponsor the family of a veteran at our 2017 programs.

In 2016, our **Legal, Insurance, and Paperwork Assistance Program** (including the **Cancer Treatment Organizer** program) was supported by funding from the NM Department of Health. Casa Esperanza and the New Mexico Cancer Center in Albuquerque have continued to be wonderful partners for this program, hosting our clinics at their facilities each month.

We also have continued to receive donations from many individuals, whose generosity greatly enhances our ability to provide services to New Mexicans coping with cancer.

In 2016, there were also many individual and corporate donations to the **Cancer Services of New Mexico Foundation**, the supporting organization established in 2005 as an endowment to help ensure the long-term financial continuity of Cancer Services of New Mexico. A portion of the Foundation's income is distributed to Cancer Services of New Mexico each year.

In addition, Booyah Media and LionSky Media continued to manage our websites on a pro bono basis throughout the year.

Operational Capability Development

We continue to be a **program-driven** organization, with extremely low overhead costs (e.g., no physical office, no full-time staff). Unlike most non-profit organizations, we do not have a paid Executive Director. CSNM's day-to-day activities are coordinated by our President, who serves as an unpaid volunteer (as do all of our Officers and Directors). Nearly all of our revenues go directly into providing services to New Mexicans touched by cancer. Nevertheless, in 2016 we continued developing our long-term operational capabilities.

We continue to focus on **developing an operating model that is not dependent on the involvement of our founders**. We have established Board-level oversight positions for each of our major programs and key functional areas, and have instituted a succession planning process for our Board Members which has facilitated the successful transition of several of our Program Directors over the last few years.

Mike Capeless and Stephanie Michnovicz both continued to do a tremendous job as the part-time Program Managers for our Family Cancer Retreats and Legal, Insurance, and Paperwork Assistance Program. In addition, Ellen Burgess, our part-time Program Coordinator, did a great job in this role in 2016. We are fortunate to be able to work with these wonderful partners.

Looking Forward

2017 is shaping up to be a very exciting year for us as we continue to expand our efforts to reduce cancer suffering for New Mexico's families. Some highlights include:

- Continued strengthening of our program offerings
 - We will continue to offer our **Family Cancer Retreat** in Albuquerque, NM, twice this year. Approximately 300 people attended our Spring Retreat from April 21-23 and we expect similar attendance at our Fall program scheduled for September 8-10, 2017.

- We will continue to develop the **Legal, Insurance, & Paperwork Assistance Program** and **Family Cancer Resource Bag Program** which will assist hundreds of cancer patients/survivors throughout New Mexico this year.
- We will continue to expand our new **Caregiver Support Program** by providing more volunteers in support of more caregivers.
- Ongoing development of our new leadership team and our wonderful cadre of volunteers
- Outstanding collaboration with our Medical Advisory Board and New Mexico's other cancer services providers
- Financial support from a diverse set of continuing contributors while also pursuing new sources of support.

We continue to focus our energies on assisting New Mexicans touched by cancer, and welcome the support of those who wish to help us fulfill our mission. As always, we truly appreciate your support for our work.
